Lions have been called the kings of the animal world. These animals can be found wild in Africa and India. Lions in Africa can go without water for up to one month, so **they** have no trouble during dry times.

Without question, lions are also one of the most popular animals to see in zoos. Almost every 200 around the world has a few lions.

It is very easy for people to tell male and female lions apart. Lions are the only kind of cat that shows this big difference between males and females. Both male and female lions have very strong mouths, They can break the backs of other animals with one bite. One lion will usually kill between ten and twenty large animals each year for food.

Past explorers have made vast contributions to our knowledge of the world today. They braved the oceans to discover the world and to bring their goods to other countries to trade.

Many explorers had to overcome their fear of the unknown to travel around the world on their sailing ships. Submitting themselves to unpredictable weather conditions, each explorer either traveled further than his predecessor or tried to find a different route to already discovered countries. Vitamin B, actually a group of vitamins, helps your body to get the energy out of carbohydrates, fats, and proteins. They also help with growth and making healthy blood. Vitamin C helps protect your cells, makes healthy fats in your skin, and gives your immune system a boost. Vitamin D helps your body absorb the calcium you need for your bones and teeth. There are a lot of minerals, but the main ones your body needs are: Calcium, Copper, Iodine, Iron, Magnesium, Phosphorous, Potassium, Selenium, Sodium and Zinc. You won't see all of these on every food label, but you might see a lot of them on your cereal boxes. Minerals generally help your body run correctly. They help your glands, organs, and body work at its best. They support your immune system, help to regulate your body's functions like breathing, growing, your heart rate, and energy production, and do many other things.
